

## The Dismissal Safety Checklist

### 10 Must-Have Elements Every School Needs Before the First Bell of Dismissal

A strong dismissal plan isn't optional, it's the backbone of student accountability, safety, and operational flow. 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#### 1. Clear Supervision Zones

#### 3. Standardized Communication Signals

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#### 4. Parent Pick-Up Verification Protocols

No exceptions, ever. Pre-approved adults, photo IDs, custody notes, and last-minute transportation changes must be **verified and documented**, not handled verbally at the pickup. This is one of the biggest breakdown points during dismissal, especially for schools juggling afterschool programs and multiple exits.

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#### 5. Bus Line Accountability

Bus routes and riders shift constantly. Your staff needs a dependable way to confirm who lined up, who boarded, and who didn't. Real-time tracking (whether digital or manual) is the only way to guarantee **student accountability** and avoid the nightly "Did that student get on the bus?" panic.

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## 6. Staff-to-Student Ratios for Outdoor Lines

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
## 7. Emergency Reunification Readiness
